Paul Jouve (1878-1973) was a French sculptor and designer. He was born in Marlotte, France, in 1878, the son of Auguste Jouve and Marlotte. He studied at the École des Beaux-Arts in Paris and was a member of the group known as the 'Jeune École'. He was particularly influenced by the work of Auguste Rodin and the Symbolist movement. Jouve's work is characterized by its organic, flowing forms and its focus on the human figure. He was a member of the Académie des Beaux-Arts and was elected to the Académie in 1923.
