LINE VAUTRIN (1913-1997)

Line Vautrin (1913-1997) was a French designer and artist. She was born in 1913 in Talosel, France, and died in 1997 in Paris. She studied at the École des Beaux-Arts in Paris and worked with Jacques-André Bonnard. Her work is characterized by its geometric forms and vibrant colors. She designed a variety of objects, including jewelry, ceramics, and furniture. Her most famous work is the "CINEMA" series, which consists of a set of decorative plates. The plates are circular and feature a central sunburst motif. The sunburst is made of small, pointed shapes that radiate from a central point.
